chairman-elect's report

Applaud the Arts has become "the" arts event in our community.

It kicks off the season - the season of the arts - in Ocala/Marion County, and it convenes representatives and even performers from across all walks of art. In 2017, the 10th annual Applaud the Arts was held in September a matter of days after Hurricane Irma blew into town. With the "Healing HeARTs" exhibit still on the walls of The Brick, an idea was inspired. The arts do heal. Musicians, vocalists, and images were used in a moving and motional tribute that depicted how Ocala comes together and will "rise" to build one another and our community up.

MCA partnered with the Community Foundation of Marion County to issue a challenge that every ticket sold after IRMA would benefit the Marion Recovery Network resulting in a \$1,650 donation to aid those impacted by the Hurricane.

In 2017, Applaud the Arts celebrated a total of \$285,000 in grant awards to (#of) nonprofit organizations' efforts to further arts and culture in our community. To think that in the year ahead,

we will cross the \$300,000 threshold has us on the edge of our seats...if by the "edge of our seats" we mean planning strategically, actively pursuing partnerships and evaluating how we can do more and be more for Ocala/Marion County. Ok, so maybe we're not in our seats at all - there is meaningful work to be done!

Here's to a year that quantified the value of the arts in our region-\$56 Million in fact. In doing so

executive director's message

I cannot emphasize enough just how grateful I am for the support of the Board of Directors, the staff, the volunteers, our City partners, sponsors, donors, artists and MCA members.

At their 2016 strategic planning retreat, your board of directors set an aspirational goal to be one of the best cities for the arts. With the help of great partners, arts organizations, dedicated arts professionals, arts enthusiasts, and funders, we are well on our way! The momentum is strong and with so many focused on growing a vibrant arts industry, the sky is the limit 1 et's take a look:

Levitt Foundation AMP Ocala Concert Series-Over a ten week period, more than 5,000 attended, the free concert series. Staged in partnership with the City of Ocala, the concert provided access to all and was held at the Historic Webb Field. The music will continue in 2018, thanks to the Levitt Foundation's approval of our grant.

Arts and Economic Prosperity Study 5-As a funding partner to this study, we were delighted to hear the results announced at the annual conference of the American for the Arts. The nonprofit arts and cultural sector is a \$56 million industry in Ocala, supporting 1,422 full-time jobs and generates \$6.1 million in local and state government revenue.

Ocala Sculpture Tour-MCA is a proud partner of this amazing collection of Public Arts. Kudos to the City of Ocala for growing our public art scene.

Magnolia Art Exchange-Through our Cultural Grants, we helped fund one of the studios that will house local artists. This Arts Incubator, located in the historic Train Depot, will serve as an important ecosystem for emerging artists.

Master Arts and Cultural Plan-MCA committed \$25K to help fund the consultant for Ocala's first Arts and Cultural Master Plan. The plan, with input from stakeholders, will yield a road map for arts and cultural development, growth and

sustainability. The plan will contain short, mid, and long term goals, assign accountability and funding requirements.

Arts and Cultural Round Tables-These monthly meetings are designed to increase collaboration and cooperation among our nonprofit arts leaders and staff.

Artist Workshops-Art Means Business. By providing information and strategies to our artists, we hope to increase their ability to make their art their business. We thank Ryan Lily, VP Business Creation and David D'Alessandris for their workshop. Look for repeat session in 2018.

MCA Cultural Grants: MCA continues its funding of nonprofit arts organization through its annual Cultural Grants Awards encouraging innovation in programming, production, and outreach. The direct support total since the inception of the grants totals \$285.000.

Four Friends Grant Fund: Having achieved and exceeded the initial goal of \$50K, MCA will launch this grant program recognizing the value individual artists contribute to the vibrancy and prosperity of our community and to help grow their capacity to thrive as artists.

It's been an amazing, almost two years since I came on board as MCA's Executive Director. I cannot emphasize enough just how grateful I am for the support of the Board of Directors, the staff, the volunteers, our City partners, sponsors, donors, artists and MCA members.

- Develop, in conjunction with the City and County, a county-wide cultural master plan providing the blueprint for increased communication, collaboration and sharing of resources among arts organizations (in process)

goal #2: funding support for the arts

Marion Cultural Alliance has expanded dedicated funding for arts organizations and artists.

- Recruit and retain strong and diverse board members who bring skills, expertise and personal connections to the board.
- Form a fund development committee to assess benefits for becoming a donor/contributor.
- · Create and name different levels of giving and their benefits.
- Develop a clear distinction between artists members and donors/sponsors.

goal #3: promoting the arts

Marion Cultural Alliance has grown art audiences and support by reaching out to school children, retirees, visitors, and the general public

- Assemble a gallery advisory committee with representatives from each of the arts to promote the arts through use of the Brick.
- Provide retail space for artists to showcase their work.
- Produce an interactive, common, on-line arts guide, common calendar and map easily accessible to the public, visitors, artists and arts organizations.
- Create opportunities, in conjunction with Magnolia Art Exchange (MAX), to support emerging artists
- Conduct workshops for artists to develop business acumen focusing on pricing, merchandising and marketing.

October Celebrating Home and State MCA welcomed emerging artist, Derrick Grimsley who attended West Port High School's MCCA program. His show paid homage to our beautiful state of Florida. By depicting the sunshine state's distinctive architecture through vibrant colors, his body of work was compelling, familiar yet lively and spirited.

November The Best of the Best Exhibit was an amazing success. Our call to artist drew 63 member artists and who showed 136 pieces. This show was bold and dynamic and really showcased the talent we have in Marion County. Showcase Properties of Central Florida and Angie Lewis, State Farm sponsored this exhibit.

December Fabrications MCA artist member David D'Alessandris presented an extremely powerful show titled: Fabrications, a prelude to his previous year's show. Visitors were not disappointed when the doors opened to see David's one man exhibit full of color and dimension.

The event, with its many unique features, sets it apart from other cycling events with its gorgeous and challenging routes through horse country, an abundance of amazing door prizes, \$2,000 in cash awards, catered buffet lunch, stunning professional photos by Tammy Griffin, entertainment after the ride and a beer garden sponsored by Tri Eagle.

The 2017 was, by far the most exciting year for the Ride for the Arts. The committee added the element of a Gran Fondo. 2017 cultural grant away ds

A committee of interested community partners reviewed grant submissions from all types of noprotift arts organizations. Some had received grants in prior years, some were new.

Mary Britt, Executive Director, Ocala Civic Theatre, conducted a very helpful workshop for those interested in the process. She commented that this is a mid-level grant and that the application and review process can assist in groups going on to apply for larger and more competitive grants. Staff of MCA were available to answer questions and review preliminary grants.

After the evaluation process was complete, \$25,000 in grants were awarded to a wide variety of applicants. From an artist in residence studio (one of MCA's strategic goals), to art therapy, from chorale to ballet, from theatre touring our schools, to sculpture and Shakespeare in the park, 12 organizations were awarded the grants during Applaud the Arts.

The committee and the MCA Board of Directors are pleased that interest in the grants is rising, and that so many of these projects will enrich the community. We look forward to receiving the evaluations and seeing the impact of the programs. And, of course, we are anticipating the new round of applications for next year!



About the MCA's Cultural Grants

Since 2002, Marion Cultural Alliance (MCA) has provided \$285,000 in direct support to our community's nonprofit arts community. Arts organization are invited to apply for grants up to \$5,000 and are open to all artistic disciplines, including music, theater, dance, visual arts, cinema, literary arts, folk arts, and photography. Historical and scientific museums may also apply.
