

#### A Message from MCA Executive Director, Jaye Baillie, APR

#### Marion Cultural Alliance—Your Local Arts Agency

Marion Cultural Alliance (MCA) was officially designated as a Local Arts Agency (LAA) by Ocala's City Council (March 2022) and the Board of County Commission (December 2023). While MCA has been performing the essential functions of an LAA as designated by Americans for the Arts since its inception, this official designation is significant in positioning our organization for funding from state, federal, and private foundations. So what are the characteristics of an LAA and how does MCA fulfill those functions?

- Makes grants to local artists and arts organizations: MCA is a major funder through its Cultural Grants, The Four Friends Grants for Artists, the Korzenny Fund for Art Educators, and the Megan Boone Grants for Performing Arts.
- Presents programming: MCA presents classes, lectures, and exhibits.
- Manages cultural facilities: Brick City Center for the Arts, home of MCA.
- Provides services to artists and arts organizations: MCA offers professional development, visibility and advocacy support, and technical assistance to artists and arts organizations. Hosts the Ocala Metro Art Scene, a robust repository of our community's arts, cultural, and historical events.
- Participates and/or leads community cultural planning: MCA partnered with the City for the development of the Master Arts Plan and is executing the roles assigned to MCA by the plan, helped fund American for the Arts Economic Prosperity Study AEP V and promoted participation by local arts organizations in AEP VI.
- Advocates and promotes arts-friendly policies: MCA's Executive Director serves on the Ocala Arts Municipal Arts Commission whose role is to develop art policy. MCA also endorsed both School District Referendums that provided arts funding K-12, among other items including school safety. MCA annually advocates, to our Legislative Delegation, for continued legislative funding of Florida's Department of Arts & Cultural annual grants.
- Forges partnerships with elected, business, and other community leaders: MCA's Business pARTnership program connects the benefits of art and arts education to the corporate community. MCA is a member of the Ocala CEP.
- Manages a public art program: MCA's foundational project, Horse Fever, and subsequent herds, was our community's first public art project. With the establishment of the Art in Business program, businesses may commission a local artist to create a horse representative of their industry.

In my role as the Executive Director and as we move into our 2024-2026 Strategic Plan, I am honored to work side-by-side with a dedicated and talented Board of Directors, an amazing team and volunteers.

Here's to an art-filled year!

#### A Message from Organizational Review Chair, Mary Ellen Poe

2023 Organizational Committee Summary

- In the early part of 2023, the final result of the Board's self-assessment of its previous year's performance was rated at 4.1 out of a possible score of 5, indicating a positive performance. Opportunities for improvement were recognized and focused on throughout the year.
- During 2023, three finance related policies were reviewed; two were approved and one will be reconsidered in 2024. The annual review of the Gift Acceptance policy was again approved. In addition, two new policies and procedures were presented and approved: a Whistleblower Policy and one related to the Leadership Succession Plan.
- Along with the executive director, we began the initial review on a new employee handbook.
- The scope of MCA's mission includes assisting other arts organizations with development of core documents. It was our privilege to again assist a newly created nonprofit arts organization in 2023.

#### MCA AS A FUNDER

The Cultural Endowment Fund was established in 2001 and initially funded with proceeds of Horse Fever. Today, it provides direct support to nonprofit arts organizations for programming, equipment, and initiatives.

To date, \$525,000 has been awarded to more than 45 nonprofit arts organizations. Additionally, the Four Friends Grant Fund supports artists for workshops, equipment, or program ideas. The Korzenny Arts Educator Fund was established in 2019 to provide supplies for teachers. This year, Actress/Director Megan Boone established the Laurie D. Reeder Grant for Performing Arts and the Nancy A. Atkinson Grant for Music in honor of two influential teachers who encouraged her when she was a student at Belleview High School.
