Additionally, our Board introduced a tiered membership program, grounded in equity, that allows donors to choose their preferred level of support.

Our students have become increasingly involved with MCA, gaining a deeper understanding of the transformative power of art and its role in strengthening our community.

MCA has also been designated the Local Arts Agency by the City of Ocala and the Board of County Commissioners with delineated ways our organization can partner with each entity and work together to grow the arts in our community. Our wide range of programs and initiatives brings together individuals from all walks of life, allowing them to explore existing passions or discover new ones.

As we enter 2025, I look forward to continuing our work in positively impacting the community through our shared mission. Together with the MCA staff, board, volunteers, and members, we are eager to demonstrate the vital role the arts play in enriching lives and fostering connection for everyone,

Our commitment to artists took a significant step forward with the establishment of the Four Friends Grants for Artists in 2017. In 2024, MCA funded 8 Four Friends grants.

Since 2001, MCA has distributed over \$3 million to artists, arts organizations, stipends, scholarships, and honorariums. But our impact goes beyond financial support. We provide artists and organizations with networking opportunities, expert advice on organizational growth, marketing support, and platforms to exhibit and sell their work.

**A Message from MCA Secretary, Mary Ellen Poe**

**Organizational Oversight:**

At the beginning of 2024, the Board self-assessment report covering 2023 was reviewed. Once again, the board member's surveys were available to establish an aggregate score of 4.46 out of a possible five, indicating Marion Cultural Alliance was considered a "healthy" organization. All written comments were positive, with Jaye and staff recognized for their work and commitment to the organization.

Two new policies were approved by the Board: Disclosure of Public Information and a Succession Planning policy and associated documents for leadership change when that time comes. It was our honor to present the latter to nonprofit business leaders at their meeting in April. There were several other policies and procedures reviewed by the Board and reapproved in 2024.

We collaborated with selected members of nonprofit organizations to significantly enhance the Ocala/Marion Community Foundation's Roadmap for Success guide. It's release date is expected in 2025.

Two new legal requirements were identified and were reviewed for needed compliance.
